Whenever in the secular year Hanukkah comes, it brings a soft glow and warmth, which helps take the edge off of the winter's frosty bite. The candles have a particular bit of wisdom to share with us.

After we recite the blessings which accompany the lighting of the hanukkiah, we add a prayer that contains this striking sentence:

"These candles are sacred, and we are not permitted to put them to any use; we may only look upon them."

In effect, the prayer declares we may not use the Hanukkah candles for any practical purpose. We may not read by their light; use them to light Shabbat candles. And except for the Shamash candle, we may not use one candle to light another.

Our Tradition teaches that the light of the hanukkiah is only to be used to promote the miracle of the Hanukkah miracle - *Pirsumei Nisah*. In other words, our candles are exclusively for looking. If we are not to use these candles for their light, instead only to look unto them, what is their true purpose?

According to the prolific American Rabbi Sydney Greenberg, the Hanukkah candles' purpose is to add "a dimension of holiness to our existence."

In our homes, we unite eight evenings of light with the pattern of daily life. Our prayers re-echo, we honor our people's history and narrative, and the songs of our tradition are heard. Our children see and participate in the symbols and rites that link them to a people and culture.

Our ever-developing personalities are woven strands of love for and devotion to the life of the Jewish community. The brilliance of light and the brightness of family coalesce in a powerful ritual. Each face is warmed by the glow of candles exclusively used for this purpose.

While our prayer encourages us not to put the candles to "use," perhaps it is because they are already in use. The lights are tasked with a great responsibility to kindle a radiance within us.

Dear Friends:

As we round the corner to the final two months of our secular year, we welcome Thanksgiving and Hanukkah just a few days later, two holidays that share so much in common: family, friendship,

warmth, food, memories, good deeds.

To be honest, for a long time, I never liked Thanksgiving. In contrast, it was my mom's favorite holiday when she was young, and meant the world to her immigrant grandparents and, as such, to her parents. This, I could understand. But, for me, other than eating a lot, there were not any religious rituals or customs that made it special for me. And, as I got older and was working, or when Phil and I had young kids, the trip back to Omaha for just a few days, and juggling too many family visits, was exhausting. Feeling this way, however, triggered my guilt and, eventually, a deeper examination.

As it turned out, it didn't take much more than a few conversations to figure out why I would have been happier skipping the holiday. When I was seven, my family and I lost my uncle and my Bubbe within the same week...just shy of Thanksgiving. The memories are seared in my brain; the sadness inescapable for far too long. That first Thanksgiving following their deaths was very, very sad. November was just a hard month. As I worked through my memories, I finally understood my desire to run from it rather than embrace it.

Over the years, of course, there have been far happier Thanksgivings for my extended family as we welcomed in-laws, babies, friends. Our youngest, Talia, was born the Monday before Thanksgiving in 2006. That small table in 1978 again grew, but it took some time for me to pull these happier memories to the front of my mind. But, as did, could I find meaning in the secular holiday the same way I do with Rosh Hashanah or Passover?

I must admit it is not a deep one, but I have learned that is ok. I now value each Thanksgiving that I can spend with my parents—that my kids can still look across the table at their Bubbe and Zayde—and am so, so grateful. As my kids have gotten older and enjoy cooking, I love talking through meal preparations with them on the years we have hosted, and just enjoying the time together and the process. While I still find the meal a bit forced, I have been able to redefine the holiday and *enjoy* the moment rather than question all that I did before.

I have also used the holiday, in more recent years, to help others, often through a donation to a local foodbank. Combining the secular holiday with tzedakah helps bridge the gap for me. BHBE offers another such opportunity by our participation in the New Trier Multifaith Alliance's virtual Thanksgiving service. This multifaith effort reminds us that none of us are alone and the holiday can and should have a spiritual meaning. Watch your email for more information on how to participate.

While I am still more excited to light our menorahs right after Thanksgiving this year. I will wake up on Thanksgiving morning, enjoy some of the annual parade and dog show on tv with my kids, and sit down at a table thankful that my family can be together in the midst of an on-going pandemic, and that our table, while missing loved ones, is full of love.

However you choose to celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday this year, I hope you, too, enjoy the moment. I look forward to sharing our celebrations together next time we gather in person or virtually, at BHBE.

MEN'S CLUB

Men's Club has remained active through the pandemic. We hold our monthly meetings on Zoom allowing members to participate from home or other remote locations. Wen have an upcoming meeting on November 17. All meetings begin at 8:15 pm, CT.

The Men's Club has several upcoming events. We continue with the "Food for Thought Breakfasts" series. This year the series is organized by Jeff Roth. On October 10, 2021, we hosted Jordyn Harris, *AIPAC's Chicago Associate Area Director, who* will speak on the "National Legislative Agenda to Support Israel". At the December 12th 10:00 AM breakfast, Michael Gideon will discuss "Travel in Germany."

Look for the Men's Club annual party night in February, 2022, "Havana '57", organized by Tom Ungar. The planning is progressing and assumes that COVID restrictions will allow the event to proceed.

Another current project is repair of the fence protecting the back kitchen entrance to the synagogue building. After the broken boards are replaced, the fence will be stained/painted along with the small out-building. Lee Bloom is organizing that repair and has done the inventory of the boards needing replacement. The project is on hold due to lack of availability of fencing boards in local lumber yards. When the shortage abates, the project will proceed.

Our other activities included the GalaRama Raffle, High Holiday Ushering, Prayer Book Repair and Sukkah Decoration. Norm Ring reported the Raffle was very successful as 10% more tickets were sold in 2021 than in the previous year. For the second year in a row, the Men's Club covered all the costs and 100% of the revenue went to the Congregation. The Men's Club also organized ushering for the High Holidays. With solicited help from congregants to cover the necessary time, they assisted entering congregants and helped check vaccination cards. Harold Primack organized several sessions to repair worn prayer books, allowing for their continued use for services. Joel Kurzman, Harold Primack and Steven Bucksbaum decorated the congregation's Sukkah on September 19. With their handy power-tools they drilled holes and then inserted twine to hang gourds inside the Sukkah.

Library Lines - Here are some newly published titles (with descriptions from the publishers):



People Love Dead Jews: Reports from a Haunted Present by Dara Horn

Renowned and beloved as a prizewinning novelist, Dara Horn has also been publishing penetrating essays since she was a teenager. Often asked by major publications to write on Dara Horn subjects related to Jewish culture-and

increasingly in response to a recent wave of deadly antisemitic attacks-Horn was troubled to realize what all of these assignments had in common: she was being asked to write about dead Jews, never about living ones. In these essays, Horn reflects on subjects as far-flung as the international veneration of Anne Frank, the mythology that Jewish family names were changed at Ellis Island, the blockbuster traveling exhibition Auschwitz, the marketing of the Jewish history of Harbin, China, and the little-known life of the "righteous Gentile" Varian Fry. Throughout, she challenges us to confront the reasons why there might be so much fascination with Jewish deaths, and so little respect for Jewish lives unfolding in the present. Horn draws upon her travels, her research, and also her own family life-trying to explain Shakespeare's Shylock to a curious ten-year-old, her anger when swastikas are drawn on desks in her children's school, the profound perspective offered by traditional religious practice and study-to assert the vitality, complexity, and depth of Jewish life against an antisemitism that, far from being disarmed by the mantra of "Never forget," is on the rise. As Horn explores the (not so) shocking attacks on the American Jewish community in recent years, she reveals the subtler dehumanization built into the public piety that surrounds the Jewish past-making the radical argument that the benign reverence we give to past horrors is itself a profound affront to human dignity. "How can a book filled with anger, a book about anti-Semitism and entitled People Love Dead Jews, be delectable at the same time? The novelist Dara Horn has done it, combining previously published pieces in a work that is far greater than the sum of its parts." - Elliot Abrams, Commentary. Israel: A Simple Guide to the Most Misunderstood Country on Earth by Noa Tishby

Israel. The small strip of arid land is 5,700 miles away but remains a hot-button issue and a thorny topic of debate. But while everyone seems to have a strong opinion about Israel, how many people actually

know the facts? Here to fill in the information gap is Israeli American Noa Tishby. But "this is not your Bubbie's history book" (Bill Maher, host of Real Time with Bill Maher). Instead, offering a fresh, 360-degree view, Tishby brings her "passion, humor, and deep intimacy" (Yossi Klein Halevi, New York Times bestselling author of Letters to My Palestinian Neighbor) to the subject, creating an accessible and dynamic portrait of a tiny country of outsized relevance. Through bite-sized chunks of history and deeply personal stories, Tishby chronicles her homeland's evolution, beginning in Biblical times and moving forward to cover

everything from WWI to Israel's creation to the disputes dividing the country today. Tackling popular misconceptions with an abundance of facts, Tishby provides critical context around headline-generating controversies and offers a clear, intimate account of the richly cultured country of Israel. "Noa Tishby writes with wit and authority. This is a fascinating-and very moving-book that should be read by anyone for whom Israel is a mystery." - Aaron Sorkin, award-winning screenwriter of The West Wing and The Social Network



From Sarah to Sydney: The Woman Behind All-of-a-Kind Family by June Cummins with Alexandra Dunietz

This is the first and only biography of Sydney Taylor (1904–1978), author of the awardwinning All-of-a-Kind Family series of books, the first juvenile novels published by a mainstream publisher to feature Jewish children

characters. The family-based on Taylor's own as a childincludes five sisters, each two years apart, dressed alike by their fastidious immigrant mother so they all look the same: all-of-a-kind. The four other sisters' names were the same in the books as in their real lives; only the real-life Sarah changed hers to the boyish Sydney while she was in high school. Cummins elucidates the deep connections between the progressive Taylor's books and American Jewish experiences, arguing that Taylor was deeply influential in the development of national Jewish identity. This biography conveys the vital importance of children's books in the transmission of Jewish culture and the preservation of ethnic heritage. "[Cummins'] portrait of Sarah, who became Sydney, a Jewish girl who became a modern American woman, is thorough and engrossing." - Jennifer Weiner, New York Times

Link, Michael, and Dana live in a quiet town. But it's woken up very quickly when someone sneaks into school and vandalizes it with a swastika. Nobody can believe it. How could such a symbol of hate end up in the middle of their school? Who would do such a thing? Because Michael was the first person to see it,

he's the first suspect. Because Link is one of the most popular guys in school, everyone's looking to him to figure it out. And because Dana's the only Jewish girl in the whole town, everyone's treating her more like an outsider than ever. The mystery deepens as more swastikas begin to appear. Some students decide to fight back and start a project to bring people together instead of dividing them further. The closer Link, Michael, and Dana get to the truth, the more there is to face - not just the crimes of the present, but the crimes of the past. With Linked, Gordon Korman, the author of the acclaimed novel Restart, poses a mystery for all readers where the who did it? isn't nearly as important as the why?
