BHBE Film Festival discussion on Zoom, Saturday, December 11, 8pm. *The Cakemaker (2017) Ofir Raul Grazier, Starring Tim Kalkhof, Sarah Adler, Roy Miller, Zohar Strauss.* This film is in English, German, and Hebrew. Thomas, a young German baker, is having an affair with Oren, a married Israeli man who frequently visits Berlin. Using a fabricated identity, Thomas infiltrates the life of Anat, Oren's wife, who owns a café in Jerusalem. Thomas finds himself involved in Anat's life in a way far beyond his anticipation, and to protect the truth, he stretches his lie to the point of no return. As we did last year, for the first offering in this season's BHBE Film Festival, we will watch the movie on our own and "gather" online to discuss it on Zoom. The Cakemaker is an excellent drama, which you may have seen in a theater. It received a 97% on Rotten Tomatoes and won seven Ophir Awards at the Israeli Academy, including Best Picture, Best Director, Best Script and Best Actress (Sara Adler.)
