Martin EP Seligman, Ph.D. professor at the University of Pennsylvania, argues that we have a uniquely human superpower, prospection. He writes: "We are the only animals who can vividly imagine scenarios we've never experienced."

Ancient humans used prospection to build temples and strategize battles. It's how we plan and prepare for life's next steps. But our thoughts about the future can also affect our mood in the present.

This is the tricky balance when it comes to Tisha b'Av because all of our holy day's texts are retrospective warnings about faithlessness, evil, and blasphemous decisions, which led to the Temples' destructions we memorialize and mourn on Tisha b'Av.

The mourning process begins on the 17th of Tammuz. Only increasing from that point on - the initial restrictions of no live concerts and celebrations grow to include no eating meat and no haircuts, thereby plunging us into a more intense focus, with the ultimate goal and risk of being engulfed in sorrow.

Even before the holy day begins, in traditional circles, the final meal is eaten while sitting on the floor or on a low stool. It consists of a piece of bread, and a hard-boiled egg dipped in ashes, symbolizing mourning.

The curtain is removed from the ark in the synagogue, and the lights are dimmed. After the evening prayers, the book of Lamentations (Eichah) is read. The leader reads aloud, and the congregation reads along in an undertone.

In the morning, the restrictions continue - the prayers are altered to reflect mourning practices, and we do not adorn our tallitot or tefillin.

However, the day is not wholly one of sorrow and pain. We see the most extreme mourning measures in the evening and morning of Tisha b'Av. Practice slowly returns to normalcy throughout the day, as is evident from relaxing certain restrictions.

In the synagogue, the ark's curtain is restored to its place before the afternoon prayers. We don our tallit and tefillin for *mincha* and it is customary to say those prayers omitted from the conclusion of the morning services. And after midday, it is again permitted to sit on chairs and benches of regular height.

Our tradition for thousands of years has clearly understood that when we look to the future with hope, it changes our attitude in the present - it ignites within us a motivation to continue.

If we were left with the words of sorrow and pain throughout the entirety of the day, we might give up on moving forward. We would model a similar mindset influenced by the exclusive prayers and poetry we sing throughout Tisha b'Av. Instead, the rabbinic thought leaders considered our prospective nature and helped us ascend from the depths to the presence of positivity and hope.

Gabriele Oettinger, a psychology professor at NYU wrote: "The past is over, and we cannot change it. The future is where all our possibilities lie."

The future possibilities are endless, and our observances of Tisha b'Av inspire us with a sense of optimism and responsibility as we pursue a more just and holier world.

In the Talmud (Shabbat 127a) we read that "The study of Torah is equal to all of the mitzvot." This assumes that Torah study leads to the fulfillment of mitzvot. In my work at BHBE, I will be asking our students to find the connections

between the Torah they study and their actions in the world. Twice per month, I will lead youth services for grades 2-6. We will continue the style of that service singing, reading Torah and drawing out the lessons of the weekly parsha. I will also be working with our older academy students studying Jewish texts that speak to their questions and concerns. During the High Holidays, I will lead the family service for Rosh Hashannah. In addition to working with students and families, I will be coordinating and teaching, along with the BHBE clergy, an introduction to Judaism course called "On One Foot" which was created by the American Jewish University. This class is for any adult who wants to dive deeper into familiar topics. It is also for anyone exploring Judaism for the first time and/or considering choosing Judaism.
