As a congregation committed to serving our community, we are happy that you are joining us, and we hope that you find today's service uplifting and enriching.

BHBE is an egalitarian and gender-inclusive Conservative synagogue in which Jewish adults of all abilities participate equally in the religious life of our community. Most of the liturgy is in Hebrew, with English prayers interspersed. We use our current prayer book that includes English translation and some Hebrew transliterations so that our congregants and guests can follow, participate, and understand the prayers.

We respectfully request that you observe these practices, which are based on Jewish religious law:

- Please do not take either tallit or prayer books into the restrooms.
- Refrain from using phones, cameras, or other electronic devices in the building on Shabbat and holidays.
- All forms of writing and photography are prohibited on Shabbat and holidays. These acts are considered “melacha” or “creative activity” and, therefore, are not allowed on sanctified days.
- Since we observe Jewish dietary laws, please refrain from bringing outside food, including gum, into the synagogue building.

BHBE is a smoke-free environment every day of the year.
