One of the distinctive characteristics of the Jewish week is the public reading of the Torah - no less than four times weekly. When there is a Rosh Chodesh, the first of the month, or a holiday, we include additional Torah readings on those days too.

We are currently in the wake of one of the most joyous moments of the entire year, the festival of Simchat Torah, "Rejoicing in the Torah." On that day, we concluded reading the book of Deuteronomy, thereby completing the Torah's Jewish educational cycle. However, as soon as we ended the reading, we unrolled the Torah across numerous tables in the Spak Social Hall, explored the Torah as a community, found favorite sections and passages, and then rerolled the Torah. This time to the very beginning of the Book of Genesis, starting with the word "Bereishit."

This practice further emboldens the concept that the reading of the Torah is never really finished; it continues uninterrupted. So too, for our study of Torah. We are never relieved of our joyous opportunities to learn about and from our tradition.

In Pirkei Avot "The Wisdom of our Sages," a first-century sage proposed the continuous study of the Torah when he wrote: "Turn it again and again, for everything is in it: contemplate it, grow gray and old over it, and swerve not from it. For there is no greater good. (Mishnah Avot 2:14"

There is a distinctive Jewish contribution to mental exercise, the unparalleled emphasis upon study as a process that only death ought to terminate. Leonardo da Vinci, who lived to a ripe old age and continued to paint masterpieces late into his more senior years, declared, "Learning keeps the soul young and decreases the bitterness of old age." There is a great benefit to continuously learning, broadening our horizons, and expanding our knowledge.

Rabbi Sidney Greenberg, the prolific American rabbi, once taught: "It is tempting to develop a permanent mindset [like concrete all mixed up and set]. But minds, like parachutes, are valuable only when open."

When we keep our minds open and alert, when we are willing to try a new skill, entertain a new thought, and develop a new friend, we remain a vital people, gaining ground and moving forward in the search for a more abundant life.

Hi,

I want to introduce myself in my new role at BHBE. I am Marsha Lyons in charge of all kiddushim – B- mitzvahs, birthdays, or anniversaries and any special events celebrated at Shabbat kiddush and just regular ones too.

Coming to services and having kiddush with your BHBE friends is a really nice way to spend Shabbat. And you know if you have the right cookie or muffin or bagel and schmear, you just sit around and schmooze a little longer. I can help you enhance or sponsor a kiddush for your simcha or just if you want a little something extra.

I work with caterers; I shop for bargains and I like to mix it up. We are currently looking to add a kid's corner sometime in November or December. Some examples of enhancing a kiddush:

For \$75-\$100 you can add fruit or muffins, bobkas or cookies to our kiddush (this is based on 60-70people). For \$150 you can add egg salad. Tuna salad is about \$175. These are examples and I am very flexible. If we have a server- hot foods like a kugel are a possibility. That could be around \$150. I would like 2 weeks' notice for unsponsored kiddushim. What Your Men's Club Does for You and the BHBE Community - The purpose of an auxiliary organization is to support and further the goals of the Synagogue as best it can. The FJMC is divided into regions. BHBE is part of the Midwest Region with clubs in Milwaukee, Chicago, St. Louis, and other Midwestern cities. Your BHBE Men's Club organizes local programs and participates in Regional and National programs.

Whom do you Call? We, the BHBE Men's Club, received several requests for support on short notice. The request was to either fund or supplement a Kiddush on different Shabbos events during the summer. These requests tended on little notice requiring the approval of the Men's Club Board via email. With each event, the Men's Club Board approved the expenditure of funds. The Men's Club also contributed to the Synagogue's advertisement in the Council of Jewish Elderly ad book. Funding the Council of Jewish Elderly ad book was not part of the Men's Club budget. The Sisterhood also requested help delivering Holiday flowers. Both Steven Bucksbaum and Jay Lawrence step forward to assist in this Sisterhood fundraiser.

High Holiday Ushers - In an effort to provide friendship and decorum to the services over Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kipper, the Men's Club organized Congregational members to usher. For many congregants, the smile they receive from the usher upon entering the building it their only contact with the Congregation during the year. Tasks include providing a cheery hello upon entering the building, showing people to a youth service, directing people to check-in for honors, helping people find a needed tallis, and assisting people who may be in some physical or health distress. Shabbat Services at Gidwitz Senior Living Facility - In conjunction with other FJMC Men's Clubs, the BHBE Men's Club assists with Shabbat service at Gidwitz. The BHBE Men's Club accepts this responsibility one Shabbat a month. Ivan Cramer, Jeff Roth and Larry Plawsky have participated in Shabbat Services at Gidwitz Senior Living Facility in Deerfield Illinois. Illinois state rules for Senior Living Facilities demand that Larry and Ivan take a PCR test during the week before the date of services. Ivan and Larry assist the staff by helping to bring residents down to the meeting room for services and then helping to return the residents to their rooms after services. Many of the residents cannot negotiate the hallways on their own and need assistance. The staff is unable to handle Saturday rush for services and appreciate the extra help that Larry and Ivan provide. All three people, Larry, Jeff and Ivan, find great satisfaction from this activity and assisting the residents of Gidwitz. Talk to them about their experience at Gidwitz when you see them at services.



Library Lines

One of the best parts of my job as BHBE Librarian is sharing Jewish literature with our Academy students on Sunday mornings. This fall during Library Time, the kindergarteners and first graders learned about misunderstandings and saying "I'm sorry" between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, searching for the four species in Israel before Sukkot and welcoming guests into the sukkah, the creation of human beings in God's image, and a classic Talmudic story about how a clever rabbi tricked twenty-nine scary witches. The fourth graders were introduced to midrash in our discussion of the Cain and Abel story, and the fifth graders moved from worry about a cat's whereabouts to relief in her survival in a Sukkot story set during devastating fires in Oakland, California, making connections between the 1991 event and more recent disasters. The Library's collection provides so many opportunities to enhance our children's learning about Jewish holidays, values, Bible stories, life cycle events, and history.



For adults, here are a couple of recently published books of interest:



The Sassoons: The Great Global Merchants and the Making of an Empire by Joseph Sassoon (2022)

They were one of the richest families in the world for two hundred years, from the 19th century to the 20th, and were known as 'the Rothschilds of the East.' Mesopotamian in

origin, and for more than forty years the chief treasurers to the pashas of Baghdad and Basra, they were forced to flee to Bushir on the Persian Gulf; David Sassoon and sons starting over with nothing, and beginning to trade in India in cotton and opium. The Sassoons soon were building textile mills and factories, and setting up branches in shipping in China, and expanding beyond, to Japan, and further west, to Paris and London. They became members of British parliament; were knighted; and owned and edited Britain's leading newspapers, including *The Sunday Times* and *The Observer*. And in 1887, the exalted dynasty of Sassoon joined forces with the banking

empire of Rothschild and were soon joined by marriage, fusing together two of the biggest Jewish commerce and banking families in the world. Against the monumental canvas of two centuries of the Ottoman Empire and the changing face of the Far East, across Europe and Great Britain during the time of its farthest reach, Joseph Sassoon gives us a riveting generational saga of the making of this magnificent family dynasty. "A marvelous epitaph to a monumental family, makers of several worlds and keepers of none. Their ancestral relics continue to light up auction houses, and their ethos flickers at the fringe of globalized finance, a warning from history that character, not calculation, is what makes and breaks the greatest fortunes." When I Grow Up: The Lost Autobiographies of Six Yiddish Teenagers by Ken Krimstein (2021)

When I Grow Up is New Yorker cartoonist Ken Krimstein's new graphic nonfiction book, based on six of hundreds of newly discovered,

never-before-published autobiographies of Eastern European Jewish teens on the brink of WWII-found in 2017 hidden in a Lithuanian church cellar. These autobiographies, long thought destroyed by the Nazis, were written as entries for three competitions held in Eastern Europe in the 1930s, just before the horror of the Holocaust forever altered the lives of the young people who wrote them. In When I Grow Up, Krimstein shows us the stories of these six young men and women in riveting, almost cinematic narratives, full of humor, yearning, ambition, and all the angst of the teenage years. It's as if half a dozen new Anne Frank stories have suddenly come to light, framed by the dramatic story of the documents' rediscovery. Beautifully illustrated, heartwrenching, and bursting with life, When I Grow Up reveals how the tragedy that is about to befall these young people could easily happen again, to any of us, if we don't learn to listen to the voices from the past. ON-SITE COMMEMORATION

Kristallnacht 84 Years Later: Special Performance of The Suitcase



WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 6:00 PM | 9603 WOODS DRIVE, SKOKIE, IL

Join us as we commemorate the 84th anniversary of the "Night of Broken Glass" with a program of remembrance, reflection, and performance. This powerful intergenerational commemoration features *The Suitcase*, a one-man show by **Tim Lorsch**, the first-born son of Jews who fled Nazi Germany in the late 1930s.

In 2016, a suitcase was found in a small antique store in the Czech Republic. This suitcase made its way to Tim Lorsch, a producer, session player, arranger and songwriter based in Nashville, Tennessee. When opened, it was discovered that the suitcase had the name of Tim's great-uncle, "Julius Israel Lorsch," inscribed inside. Blending narrative storytelling with music and archival video, The Suitcase weaves a multi-layered story of both the Lorsch family and Tim's discovery of their history, community, and survival.

The performance will be preceded by remarks from dignitaries, a candle-lighting ceremony featuring Survivors and descendants of Survivors, as well as memorial prayers with **Cantor Roytman**.
