On the Jewish calendar, the summer months are primarily absent of special days. There is one noteworthy exception Tisha B'Av, the ninth day of the Hebrew month of Av, and what a unique and solemn time it is. On that day, traditional Jews observe a

twenty-four-hour fast commemorating the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem in 586 BCE and 70 CE, respectively. Both calamities occurred on the same day, albeit some 600 years apart.

Tisha B'Av and its observances overflow with sadness and introspection - the special day can be especially deflating and discouraging. So it is no wonder we need to be lifted back up after Tisha B'Av because we find ourselves so very low at its conclusion. The Sabbath following this melancholy anniversary is titled the "Sabbath of Comfort." It is so designated because the prophetic portion read in the synagogue on that day begins with the words: "Nachamu, nachamu, ami - Comfort my people, comfort them, says your God (Isiah 40:1)."

One of the primary goals of religion is to provide comfort, especially in times when we are most distressed. According to the prolific American Rabbi Sidney Greenberg, "For all of life's bruises and aches, for the soul's distress and anguish, for grief and loneliness, for disillusionment and despair for all these afflictions we look to our faith - whatever it may be - for consolation and comfort." But religion should not only comfort us when we are disturbed; it should also disturb us when we are comfortable.

The prophets who would soothe with compassion when their people were heartsick could also scold with bitter condemnation when their people appeared heartless. Isaiah, the prophet who called out, "Comfort, comfort my people..." was the same prophet who cried out, "Woe unto the rebellious children (Isaiah 30:1)."

We know that when religion offers peace of mind, we feel the warmth and closeness to our tradition. We also know that when faith stirs our conscience and turns toward the world, it builds its own highest purposes. Our tradition can best serve us today not by encouraging our complacency but by shattering it. "Noble discontent," it has been said, "is the path to heaven." It is also a good way to walk the earth.



Thank you to each of you who participated in any or every aspect of Pride Weekend.






Library Lines

🙀 ھ On Repentance And Repair: Making Amends in REPENTANCE an Unapologetic World by Danya Ruttenberg (2022, National Jewish Book Award and Sophie Brody Honorable Mention) American culture focuses on letting go of DANYA RUTTENBERG grudges and redemption narratives instead of the perpetrator's obligations or recompense

for harmed parties. As survivor communities have pointed out, these emphases have too often only caused more harm. But Rabbi Danya Ruttenberg knew there was a better model, rooted in the work of the medieval philosopher Maimonides. For Maimonides, upon whose work Ruttenberg elaborates, forgiveness is much less important than the repair work to which the person who caused harm is obligated. The word traditionally translated as repentance really means something more like return, and in this book, returning is a restoration, as much as is possible, to the victim, and, for the perpetrator of harm, a coming back, in humility and intentionality, to behaving as the person we might like to believe we are. Maimonides laid out 5 steps: naming and owning harm; starting to change/transformation; restitution and accepting consequences; apology; and making different choices. Applying this lens to both our personal relationships and some of the most significant and painful issues of our day, including systemic racism and the legacy of enslavement, sexual violence and harassment in the wake of #MeToo, and Native American land rights, On Repentance and Repair helps us envision a way forward. Maimonides: Faith in Reason by Alberto Manguel (2023) Moses ben Maimon, or Maimonides (1138–1204), was born in Córdoba, Spain. The gifted son of a judge and mathematician, Maimonides fled Córdoba with his family when he was thirteen due to Almohad persecution of all non-Islamic

faiths. Forced into a long exile, the family spent a decade in Spain before settling in Morocco. From there, Maimonides traveled to Palestine and Egypt, where he died at Saladin's court. As a scholar of Jewish law, a physician, and a philosopher, Maimonides was a singular figure. His work in extracting all the commanding precepts of Jewish law from the Hebrew Bible and the Talmud, interpreting and commenting on them, and translating them into terms that would allow students to lead sound Jewish lives became the model for translating God's word into a language comprehensible by all. His work in medicine—which brought him such fame that he became Saladin's personal physician—was driven almost entirely by reason and observation. In this biography, Alberto Manguel examines the question of Maimonides' universal appeal—he was celebrated by Jews, Arabs, and Christians alike. In our time, when the need for rationality and recognition of the truth is more vital than ever, Maimonides can help us find strategies to survive with dignity in an uncertain world. Bad Jews: A History of American Jewish **Politics and Identities** by Emily Tamkin

Throughout American history, Jewish identities have evolved and transformed in a variety of ways. The issue of what it means, or doesn't, to be a Good Jew or a Bad Jew is

particularly fraught at this moment, American Jews feel and fear antisemitism is on the rise. There are several million people who identify as American Jews—but that doesn't mean they all identify with one another. American Jewish history is full of discussions and debates and hand wringing over who is Jewish, how to be Jewish, and what it means to be Jewish. In *Bad Jews*, Emily Tamkin examines the last 100 years of American Jewish politics, culture, identities, and arguments. Drawing on over 150 interviews, she tracks the evolution of Jewishness throughout American history, and explores many of the evolving and conflicting Jewish positions on assimilation; race; Zionism and Israel; affluence and poverty, philanthropy, finance, politics; and social justice. From this complex and nuanced history, Tamkin pinpoints perhaps the one truth about American Jewish identity: It is always changing. (from the publisher)



The Latecomer: A Novel by Jean Hanff Korelitz (2022)

The Latecomer follows the story of the wealthy, New York City-based Oppenheimer family, from the first meeting of parents Salo and Johanna, under tragic circumstances, to their triplets born during the early days of IVF.

As children, the three siblings – Harrison, Lewyn, and Sally – feel no strong familial bond and cannot wait to go their separate ways, even as their father becomes more distanced and their mother more desperate. When the triplets leave for college, Johanna, faced with being truly alone, makes the decision to have a fourth child. What role will the "latecomer" play in this fractured family? A complex novel that builds slowly and deliberately, The Latecomer touches on the topics of grief and guilt, generational trauma, privilege and race, traditions and religion, and family dynamics. It is a profound and witty family story from an accomplished author, known for the depth of her character studies, expertly woven storylines, and plot twists.
