Four days in the year serve as the New Year, each for a different purpose: On the first of Nisan is the New Year for kings; On the first of Elul is the New Year for animal tithes; On the first of Tishrei is the New Year for counting years, for calculating Sabbatical Years and Jubilee Years; On the first of Shevat is the New

Year for the tree; this ruling is in accordance with the statement of Beit Shammai. But Beit Hillel say: The New Year for trees is on the fifteenth of Shevat.

As we reach the month of Shevat, we prepare to celebrate a joyful and fruitful day dedicated to sustaining the world around us, Tu BiShvat. Tu BiShvat is often referred to as the birthday of the trees - and this is an apt description of this special occasion. During the Temple Periods in the Land of Israel, farmers were required to know the age of their trees to help them determine what dedication of their produce would be gifted to the Temple. In the first century of the Common Era, the rabbinic thought leaders were aware that keeping track of every tree planted and its planting date would be onerous, so they crafted a comprehensive system for maintaining their records. Namely, to give all trees the same birthday, regardless of when they were planted. Even if you planted a tree the day before Tu BiShvat in the temple period, your tree would turn one year old, and the status of its fruit should be determined by its assigned birthdate.

Recognizing Tu BiShvat took on a different meaning following the Second Temple's destruction. Instead of being used for calculation, now there was a date assigned annually to celebrate the trees, their produce, and, in fact, all of the ecological wonders from which we benefit. It is a mitzvah to cultivate and derive joy from the world around us. So important is our connection to nature; according to the rabbinic tradition, our Synagogue prayer spaces should have windows that allow the outside world in.

Since the founding of the modern State of Israel, especially with its early agrarian culture, Tu BiShvat offers another perspective. In the context of the Jewish journey, trees represent renewal, growth, and a sense of blossoming toward a brighter future. So, the trees of Israel have incredibly weighty symbolism.

In all contexts, Tu BiShvat can further enrich our relationships with nature, one another, and the Land of Israel. May this New Year of the Trees encourage us to celebrate the majestic world surrounding us and further our appreciation and connection to the beauty and majesty of the Divine's creation.





Cubs at Brewers in Milwaukee, Sunday June 30, 2024

One of the best parts of my job as BHBE Librarian is sharing Jewish literature with our Academy students on Sunday mornings. This fall during Library Time, the kindergartners and second graders learned about the weekly Torah portions and holidays through picture books. In addition to reading about Biblical characters and holidays, the third and fourth graders were introduced to Jewish values in books about Rabbi Hillel, for whom our synagogue is named, and Eliza Davis, a Jewish reader who made a difference by bravely confronting Charles Dickens about his negative portrayal of Jews in his novel Oliver Twist. Fifth, sixth, and seventh graders are grappling with tough issues such as antisemitism, loss and depression, and war in Israel in 1967 in our reading of award-winning chapter books. The Library's collection provides so many opportunities to enhance our children's learning about Jewish holidays, values, Bible stories, life cycle events, and history.



For adults, here are a few recently published books of interest:



EHEAVEN The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store by James McBride (2023) In 1972, when workers in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, were digging the foundations for a new development, the last thing they expected to find was a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held secrets kept by the

residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. Chicken Hill was where Moshe and Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. When the state came looking for a deaf boy to institutionalize him, it was Chona and Nate Timblin, the Black janitor at Moshe's theater and the unofficial leader of the Black community on Chicken Hill, who worked together to keep the boy safe. As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community-heaven and earth-that sustain us. The Little Liar by Mitch Albom (2023) Beloved bestselling author Mitch Albom returns with a powerful novel of hope and forgiveness that moves from a coastal Greek city during WWII to America in the golden age of Hollywood, as the intertwined lives of three young survivors are

forever changed by the perils of deception and the grace of redemption. Eleven-year-old Nico Krispis has never told a lie. His schoolmate, Fannie, loves him because of it.

Nico's older brother Sebastian resents him for both these facts. When their young lives are torn apart during the war, it will take them decades to find each other again. Nico's innocence and goodness is used against his tightly knit community when a German officer barters Nico's reputation for honesty into a promise to save his loved ones. When Nico realizes the consequences of the betraval, he can never tell the truth again. He will spend the rest of this life changing names, changing locations and identities, desperate to find a way to forgiveness-for himself and from the people he loves most. Narrated by the voice of Truth itself, The Little Liar is a timeless story about the power of love to ultimately redeem us, no matter how deeply we blame ourselves for our mistakes. Leaving Eastern Parkway by Matthew Daub (2023) Brooklyn's Hasidic community of Lubavitchers is turned upside down when family tragedy strikes and everyday life changes forever in the life of Zev Altshul. ATTHEW DAUB He is first placed into the care of the closed and close-

knit community where he grew up, but soon realizes he can't stay. His saving grace is handball; it's his gift from God, and the one thing he can rely on as he is shuttled, chased, and abandoned by trusted elders, family, and friends. Even as Zev never fully escapes from the guilt of his choices, he sets course across the United States to discover where loyalty really lies and what it means. He seeks out his long-lost sister, only to find himself as unprepared for life outside the Lubavitcher community as he was unwilling to remain. Forced out of his second home, Zev plays handball to support himself in the govische world, but obligations he doesn't fully understand still tie him to Crown Heights and follow him to Chicago and New Mexico threatening always to return Zev to life among the Lubavitchers.
