I have always appreciated narratives about wisdom imparted to youth, such as the stories of college professors who offer lessons like this one about priorities.

A professor enters the classroom with a collection of items. She places them

on the table at the front of the room. First is a large empty jar, in which she pours golf balls, pebbles, and sand, gently rocking the jar after each set of items is added. And just when it seems like there is not another centimeter of space, one good shake, and there is room at the top of the jar. She finally pours in two small cups of coffee.

She asked her students at which point they thought the jar was full. They answered after each item that it looked like no other element could be added, but every time, they were wrong. The professor taught: "In life, it feels like no other thing can be added to the heavy load we carry. And yet, more and more is added every day. So, the golf balls represent our professional responsibilities. The pebbles our social responsibilities. And the sand our familial responsibilities. We can make space for everything with intention, even when it feels too much."

"What about the coffee?" the students asked. The professor replied, "Well, there's always room for a good cup of coffee with a good friend."

The lesson of this story is to invest in the parts of life that are meaningful to us. Ensure there is always space for the important things - especially when it feels like there is no space available.

What the professor in our story left out is the jar's meaning. What does the jar represent? It represents life in and of itself. And about the jar, we could find the most important lesson: without safety, security, and support, it's impossible to fill the jar with anything.

When feeling in existential danger, how can one think about professional, personal, and familial responsibilities? How can one focus on their learning when they cannot even get to class? How can one concentrate on friendships when they feel their friends have abandoned them? This is what Jewish and Zionist students of all faiths face on college campuses. The jar cannot be adequately filled because the jar is at risk. I began - by discussing my affinity for narratives that describe the meaningful education of youth. Of which there are plenty. I especially appreciate those that recount the imparting of essential wisdom.

However, that transmission of wisdom can be absent for college students now. At universities across the country, anti-Israel protests flow like a rushing torrent, overwhelming the schools, their student population, leadership, and our Jewish and Zionist students of all faiths. There are numerous reports about our Jewish students who feel unsafe to the furthest extent possible, and as we read the headlines, it is no mystery as to why that is.

Violence and chants that I would never repeat especially from the Bimah - have left college campuses in dire straights for our students. A rabbi at Columbia University encouraged Jewish students not to return until calm and safety were restored on campus. For their safety, they should not go to school.

What should be a place where they grow and learn at a high level. Where students make such substantial financial investments into their educational experience, not to mention the countless hours they dedicate to thriving in these environments, these are now unsafe surroundings.

In this week's Torah Portion, Acharei Mot, we explore issues of impropriety, conduct for Yom Kippur, and additional details about the sacrificial system. There is another essential piece of this parsha—namely, the status of leaders.

For the Jewish ritual leaders, the Priests, Aaron instructs them: "You shall be clean of all of your sins before God." What sins? We often think of these leaders as pure and beyond reproach. And yet, they have just as much to atone for as the typical Israelite. Let's look at Aaron alone for evidence of this concept. Aaron is the one who participated in the Israelite's greatest sin, the sin of the Golden Calf. He behaved inappropriately. And such is possible for all leaders.

Leaders can behave irresponsibly, unethically, and immorally, which is evident in the leadership of particular university administrations and leaders. This recognition of the importance of the administration in no way absolves the actions of university students who are leading and participating in these anti-Israel protests. Instead, it is a statement of the importance of leadership during this tumultuous time.

There is an exceptional effort that certain leaders, many of whom are Jewish, are making on college campuses and working to ensure the safety of our students during these challenging times. A number of the brave leaders are members of this congregation. And others deeply connected to our community. For their bravery and wisdom, we are eternally grateful.

This section of the Torah warns that a leader's character and ethical behavior matter, regardless of their charisma, skills, or success in serving a cause. A leader's conduct impacts the entire community and its moral agenda, irrespective of how much money is raised or how many people are served.

We desperately need university leaders who will endeavor tirelessly to ensure the safety of Jewish students. To ensure that Jewish and Zionist students of all faiths can fill their jars with all life's essential elements. And we must support our students to the best of our abilities as they face the near impossible. We pray for their safety and security in mind, body, and soul.


